SOIL TYPES DEFINED

The following soil types are used in the "Quick Facts" for each plant. They are meant as a general guideline as to what type of soil a plant prefers for successful growth. Many plants are widely adaptable, while others require a much more specific soil type.

- 1. Prefers Clay** – this plant grows best in clay (and other moisture retentive clay-loam soils) but not in sandy or rocky soil.
- 2. Sandy or Rocky Soils** – this plant must be grown in a sandy or rocky soil.
- 3. Most Soil Types Including Clay** – This is an adaptable plant that grows well in all but extreme soil types or low areas that have constantly wet soil.
- 4. Low Fertility, Well-Drained Soil** – this plant likes a soil that is not very fertile (low organic matter/humus content) and drains quickly after a rain (typical of many Western soils). Note; plants that like this soil type can also be planted in "Sandy or Rocky Soils"
- 5. Compost Enriched Garden Loam** – this plant likes well worked soils that have been enriched with compost and will be fertilized regularly with compost and other organic fertilizers to build up the soil's organic content. Also includes naturally rich, dark loamy soils with plenty of organic matter.

Soil Acidity and Alkalinity

All the plants in this catalog grow well in alkaline soil conditions. If you garden in soil that is acidic, add lime to the soil before you plant, to raise the soil's pH and make it more alkaline.

Note; plants that like acidic soils will not tolerate even slightly alkaline soils. Lowering soil pH is more difficult than raising soil pH.

ADDITIONAL TERMS DEFINED

- Broom** – Conifer trees sometimes have mutations that appear as a cluster of tiny stems on a branch. These tiny stems are cut and grafted to a root stock of that same species to create a miniature or dwarf conifer offspring.
- Calyx** – A sheath or tube that holds the flower (or corolla) and later the seed after the flower (corolla) has been pollinated.
- Loam** – A soil composed of three different soil particles, silt, sand or clay in roughly equal proportions. Soil can also be described as a clay-loam or sandy-loam etc., meaning that the soil contains much more clay or sand particles than the other two types of soil particles. Loam soils are rich in nutrients, have good drainage and make an excellent garden soil.
- Sport** – Plants will sometimes have a spontaneous mutation that grows from the plant's branches or crown (junction between root and stem). When this "sport" is cut from the parent plant and propagated a new plant variety (or cultivar) is created.
- Tilth** – A characteristic of soil structure that describes in part, how "heavy" or "light" the soil is. A soil with "good tilth" is one that has a good texture facilitating the movement of air and water in and out of that soil. A soil with poor tilth is often compacted and chunky and has poor movement of air and water in and out of that soil.
- Xeric** – From the Greek root *xeri* for dry, needing little moisture. Xeric, water thrifty, and drought tolerant are used interchangeably to indicate plants or gardens needing little supplemental watering, once established.
